## **Abstract**

The CHIP Consortium is a multi-country multi-organisation consortium that aims to reduce the infection and antimicrobial resistance burden in children under 5 across slums in low- and middle-income countries using a One Health technology enabled citizen science approach.

Led by Aceso Global Health Consultants, its members span a range of organisations which include: University College London, Hong Kong University, Indonesia One Health University Network, Columbia University, Rajasthan University of Veterinary Sciences, Save the Children India, Jawaharlal Nehru University, St Luke's University Tokyo, Jeevan Ashram Sanstha, Georgetown University, Public Health Foundation of India & University of Antofagasta.

Dr Logan will present on the findings to date across India, Indonesia & Chile alongside upcoming work in Sierra Leone & Indonesia.
