Abstract

Universal health coverage (UHC) is a phrase frequently used in healthcare discussions today. What does it actually mean and how is it applicable to Singapore? This session discusses concepts of health financing relevant to Singapore and compares it with our regional neighbours. We will discuss pluralistic health financing systems and the evaluation of health financing strategies.
