

Making an economic case for Egypt's population-wide screening for Non-Communicable Diseases (NCDs)





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Egypt has a much higher non-communicable diseases (NCDs) burden and mortality than the global average and faces more challenges in meeting SDG Target 3.4 on pre-mature death. Large-scale population-wide NCD screening campaigns and management is costly and challenging to implement. We aim to build an economic case for public investment by evaluating the cost-effectiveness of implementing the 100 Million Healthy Lives NCD screening campaign compared with the consequences of a counterfactual scenario of no screening over a 15-year time horizon. The study demonstrates the feasibility and economic value of public investment in NCD screening in Low- and Middle-Income Countries (LMICs).



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
