Frequently Asked Questions

When does the course start?

The course launches on 01 August 2022. Pre-course launch registration starts on 24 June 2022*.

This is an ongoing online course. You can sign up anytime, there is no specific date for registration.

How is the course delivered?

This course is conducted fully online. Learners will access materials such as videos, animated presentations, readings, assessments on the Learning Management System (LMS) at own pace and time.

What is the duration of the course?

Learners will be given 1 month to access the course materials and complete the course.

How do I access the course?

Learners will be directed to the Learning Management System (LMS) to access the course upon registration.*

**Learners who register before 01 August 2022 will only gain access to the course on 01 August 2022.*

Will I receive a certificate after completion?

Learners will be awarded an e-certificate of completion upon successful completion of the online course.*

**Learners will need to obtain 80% passing mark for the post-test and complete all required components and evaluation to be awarded the e-certificate.*

Will I be able to obtain accreditations for this course?

This course is pending accreditation from the Singapore Medical Council and Singapore Nursing Board. This is only applicable for local learners.
