

# LEARNINGS FROM THE COMPASS COHORT STUDY OF ADVANCED CANCER PATIENTS

Since 2015, researchers from Lien Centre for Palliative Care (LCPC Duke-NUS), National Cancer Centre Singapore (NCCS), Singapore General Hospital (SGH), and the National University Cancer Institute (NCIS) have followed some 600 patients and their family caregivers every 3 months. This session discusses published research findings and upcoming work from this ongoing cohort study.
