

Non-communicable diseases (NCDs) are the quiet emergency claiming lives every day.

NCDs also strain health systems, limit economic growth, and affect communities for generations. Asia, home to a growing ageing population, is especially susceptible to NCDs, making prevention and effective interventions urgent for the world's largest continent.

Course Description

Participants of this course will be provided with an overview of the global burden of NCDs with a focus on Asia. It is curated for participants who are keen to learn more about NCD prevention and the implementation and evaluation of NCD interventions in the region. Participants will learn key epidemiological concepts and understand the challenges and opportunities present in the prevention of key NCDs such as cancer, cardiovascular diseases, and mental health. With a focus on health systems, the course will also highlight the implications of NCD patterns and trends on health systems and the need for integrated NCD care.
