

About the Programme

The SDGHI Global Health Fellows Programmes seeks to support and encourage the growth of Global Health practitioners within the SingHealth Duke-NUS Academic Medical Centre (AMC). It aims to grow a cadre of Global Health leaders within the AMC who can:

- Contribute to global and population health-related initiatives
- Provide academic leadership to global and population health programmes
- Contribute to the development and teaching of future local training programmes in Global Health as a member of our community of practice
- Drive Global Health work with SDGHI as a faculty member of the institute

Three Key Components

The Programme will expose individuals to learning through the following three major components:

- Completion of a Master of Public Health at the Saw Swee Hock School of Public Health, National University of Singapore
 - Fellows must be first enrolled in the Master of Public Health (Global Health) at the Saw Swee Hock School of Public Health on a part-time basis, and must complete the programme in 2 years
 - Fellows must select the **Global Health track**, completing all the Global Health specialisation core modules and other relevant modules

2. Lead a Field Research Project

- Fellows may apply for a Global Health Fellows Programme Scholarship Research Grant from SDGHI to support a field research project (capped at SGD15,000) by submitting a separate grant proposal prior to the start of the project.
- This research grant is only applicable for field research projects carried out for fulfilment of the requirements of the MPH programme.
- 3. Preparation of one or more Global Health manuscripts for publication

Learning Outcomes

At the end of the Programme, Fellows will be able to:

- Analyse health needs of populations, health care systems and policies across different settings
- Conceptualise and conduct field based healthcare related research projects
- Design, monitor and evaluate sustainable and effective health programmes at local, national and international levels
- Demonstrate ethical reasoning and professional integrity in the application of principles of health equity and social justice
- Demonstrate skills in advocacy, collaboration and negotiations

Programme Support Entitlements

As an SDGHI Global Health Fellow, the following will be supported:

- 1. Course fee to undertake the 24-month, part-time Master in Public Health at the Saw Swee Hock School of Public Health, including miscellaneous fees*
- 2. Salary during absence from work to undertake the Master in Public Health for a maximum period of 3 months over two years
- 3. An additional grant of up to SGD15,000 to undertake a field research project (locally or overseas)#

Programme Eligibility Criteria

All applicants must fulfil the following criteria before submitting their application:

- 1. Fulfil admission criteria of the Master in Public Health programme at SSHSPH
- 2. Is currently at least an Associate Consultant of SingHealth and/or any of its institutions

Selection Criteria

Priority will be given to candidates who:

- Demonstrate maturity, integrity and cross-cultural awareness / sensitivity
- Commit to contribute to the development of global health in our region and to building the necessary capabilities in the SingHealth Duke-NUS AMC

How to Apply

- 1. Complete and endorse the **Application Form**, including your statement of motivation for wanting to be part of this programme
- 2. Apply for the **Master in Public Health programme at the SSHSPH** (applications close 1 Nov 2025)
- 3. Attach the following documents:
 - a. One letter of recommendation each from:
 - i. An ACP Chairperson
 - ii. An SDGHI Faculty
 - b. Updated Curriculum Vitae
 - c. A duplicate of all documents submitted for the Master in Public Health programme at the SSHSPH, including your personal statement
