## Lorelei LINGARD, PhD

Lorelei Lingard is an internationally recognized researcher in the study of communication and collaboration on healthcare teams. She is a tenured Professor in the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry at Western University. With a PhD in Rhetoric, Dr. Lingard brings a unique and powerful approach to the field. For almost 20 years, she has studied the communication practices of clinical teams, in order to support evidence-based educational initiatives to improve teamwork. Through more than 200 published manuscripts and book chapters, Dr. Lingard has described the central role of language in clinical teamwork. In recent years, she has used this research to shift the discourse of 'competence' in medical education, so that we are paying attention to not only individual competence but also collective competence. In 2014, Dr. Lingard was awarded the prestigious appointment of Fellow of the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences, in recognition of the impact of her work on Canadian healthcare.



# Closing Plenary Session

Wednesday 25 October



Koong Heng Nung is a practising thoracic surgeon in Singapore. He worked in the public sector for 25 years and was Chief of Surgical Oncology at the National Cancer Centre Singapore for 6 years. During that period, he also oversaw the development and management of Duke-NUS Surgical Clerkship, and was recognized by students with several awards including a Golden Apple Award for program innovation. In 2011, he started the “[Tobacco Free Generation](#)” social movement, reframing old paradigms on tobacco control at the societal level. From 2015, international stakeholders including youths, mayors, key opinion leaders, and international organisations began working with him to weave these re-defined concepts into the social norms of younger generations. Through telling the story of this journey, Dr. Koong will cite experiences and insights considered necessary for future healthcare workers’ global advocacy perspectives, and will promote advocacy as a necessary competency for the 21<sup>st</sup> century physician.
